Planning	I have today had a discussion about this application with the case officer Daniel Cameron.
application	His initial assessment of the site is complex, I will try to summarise it here:
DC/21/00366	The adjacent site was granted outline permission in 2018 when the Council could
Westhorpe Road	not demonstrate a 5 year land supply and many applications were being allowed
Finningham	as a result. However, this does establish a principle of development in that area
	which might make a refusal difficult to defend.
	2. These two sites were put forward for development in a "call for sites" but was
	assessed as having poor connectivity to Finningham and therefore did not make it
	into the proposed JLP settlement boundary.
	3. The flooding and mud problems on the road would not be a material planning
	consideration as this are expected to be temporary – ie associated with the
	construction and not long-term.
	4. The Core Strategy which designated Finningham as a countryside village is now
	somewhat out of date, also the Joint Local Plan is not yet approved and so the
	National Policy Planning Framework paragraph 11 has more impact – ie the
	presumption in favour of sustainable development.
	5. Finningham has few services and so residents will likely be dependent on the
	private motor car – contrary to other parts of the NPPF.
	6. The impact on nearby a listed building and potentially loss of light/overlooking
	are material considerations.
	7. The two sites together would trigger a requirement to provide affordable housing
	8. In summary, an officer would likely grant outline permission with conditions
	unless the application is called-in.
Finningham	The flooding next to the building site on Westhorpe road has lessened with the better
flooding	weather but is still not resolved: we do now have County Council Highways saying that
	maintenance to the gulleys was not completed correctly last year and further action is
	being taken.
2021 census	Residents should have received a card about the census which is being held on March
	31 st . Information packs are coming in the post. The census can be completed online or
	on paper for those unable or unwilling to do it online.
Covid support	MSDC has extended support for struggling households for another year through Local
	Council Tax Support (LCTS).
	There are a range of grants available to support businesses affected by the lockdown,
	details are on the Council's website and telephone help is also available.
Budget 2021/22	The administration's budget was approved at a full council meeting in February. A small
	increase in council tax was approved (the opposition voted against this). However, £4m
	was set aside for recovery projects, ideas to be developed by cross-party working groups.

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
